## **Derbyshire Treasures and the Parwich Hoard**

## **Neolithic Lifeways in Derbyshire: New evidence from Fox Hole Cave and Carsington Pasture Cave**

Scientific processes such as stable isotope analysis of human teeth and bone have greatly advanced our understanding of how people lived in the past. This talk will explore what isotope analysis can tell us about the individuals buried in Derbyshire during the Early Neolithic Period (4000-3400 BC), including their diet, health, mobility and even who they were.

## **Restoring the medieval Chapel window at Haddon Hall**

Haddon Hall is one of the loveliest medieval houses in the country. The Chapel east window dates from the early 15th century and is attributed to the celebrated glazier John Thornton of Coventry. A substantial programme of repair and restoration was carried out to the window, with the benefit of a Culture Recovery Fund grant during COVID lockdown. This talk covers aspects of the history of the window and the technicalities and restoration skills related to the work.
